## I. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

**INTRODUCTION** : The Catholic Church in India has always played an important role in the fields of education, health care, social welfare and development of the community. The Catholic Bishops' Conference of India (C.B.C.I.) in response to a felt need decided to establish a Medical College and Teaching Hospital "to provide for the relief of suffering, to promote and preserve the health of the community and to give an example of enlightened training in dedicated service, which is characteristic of Christian education and social welfare institutions." St. John's Medical College and Hospital and School of Nursing were started in 1963, 1975 and 1980, respectively, at Bangalore by the C.B.C.I. Society for Medical Education. The School of Nursing was upgraded to the College of Nursing in 1989.

**AIMS** : While the Institution is intended primarily for training Catholics and especially dedicated personnel like Religious Sisters who are conducting a large number of hospitals and dispensaries mainly in medically under-served and rural areas of our country, it is open, like all other educational institutions under Catholic auspices, to all persons irrespective of religion, caste or community.

The Institution seeks to make a qualitative contribution to health care, medical education and research through the training of medical, paramedical, nursing, health management, community health workers, and other personnel who are dedicated to healing in the Spirit of Christ.

The College Hospital is intended to assist in the training and to render service in health care to all people irrespective of religion, caste or community, particularly the underprivileged and disadvantaged.

**OBJECTIVES** : Under the overall policy of the C.B.C.I. Society for Medical Education, the objectives of the Institution are grouped as follows:

1. Excellence in all fields of health care education.
2. Adequate Christian formation of the students.
3. Upholding respect for life, from the moment of conception to its natural end.

4. A genuine feeling of compassion for the patients and their families as persons.
5. A special thrust to Community Health fostering the dimensions of participatory team work.
6. Serving the health needs of medically under-served areas of our country and our medically underprivileged brethren.
7. Acquiring the ability to research, and application of the advances in scientific knowledge to the relevant fields of work.
8. Striving towards promoting holistic health.
9. Acquiring an exemplary steadfastness to principles and moral values so as to witness to a life of honesty and integrity.

Right from its inception St. John's set before it an ideal of excellence in academic courses as well as service to society, as a result of which it has truly become holistic both in its outlook and in its approach to the problems of community health.

This Institution of Health and Healing envisages also the training and participation of the community - including the rural folk and the slum dwellers - in health care, in its preventive, promotive and rehabilitative aspects.

The Institution expects its students to uphold the ethical values and principles of morality as interpreted by the Catholic Church. The prospective student has the freedom to choose or reject these, but the choice is made before enrollment.

The Institution prepares students for the role of future leaders, loyal to the highest ideals of the health profession. Today's Doctors, Nurses and other Health Care Professionals are part of a team who deliver comprehensive health care. Often they are called upon to be leaders in society helping in all developmental activities. Health is both a means and an end of development improving the quality of life. The students in medical and health care sciences, therefore, should be conscious of social, economic and other factors, the improvement of which will bring about the necessary transformation to make it possible for all in this country and the world to lead a healthy human existence.

## II. HISTORY

The Catholic Church in India had long felt the need of adding a Medical College to the many educational and social welfare institutions through which over the years, it has served the country. However, the complexities such a venture involved, delayed its active consideration until the proposal was pursued by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of India. At the request of the C.B.C.I., the late Archbishop of Madras, the Most Rev. Louis Mathias, SDB, prepared and presented a report in 1954, in which he reviewed the total requirement of the project. In 1956, Archbishop Mathias with the aid of medical and financial experts, submitted a comprehensive scheme to the C.B.C.I., and in September 1960, the C.B.C.I. took the decision to establish a Medical College, with an attached hospital at Bangalore.

His Holiness Pope John XXIII agreed to the College being called after his patron, St. John the Baptist, as a mark of his personal interest in the project, and of his approval of its aims and ideals. The College was accordingly named "St. John's Medical College" and opened in temporary premises at Bangalore in July 1963.

In the course of their Joint Pastoral issued in connection with the XXXVIII International Eucharistic Congress, held in Bombay in 1964, the Catholic Bishops' Conference of India announced their choice of the College project as the Chief Memorial of the Congress. This choice received the warm approval of His Holiness, Pope Paul VI, which was conveyed by him in a special message addressed to His Eminence, Valerian Cardinal Gracias, the then President of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of India, and President of the C.B.C.I. Society for Medical Education. His Holiness has also established a scholarship in the College in his own name, to be awarded, each year, to the best all-round student completing the MBBS course.

The Corner Stone of the Project was blessed by His Holiness at Bombay during the principal function of the Congress, held on December 3, 1964, at which he officiated. It was laid at the Project site on July 27, 1965 by His Excellency, Shri V.V. Giri, the then Governor of Karnataka, and later, President of India. On the completion of the buildings, the College was dedicated to the cause of Medical Education, Research and Care, on September 29,

1968, at a ceremony presided over by the late President of India, His Excellency Dr. Zakir Hussain.

Prior to the completion of these buildings, the College was located in the premises of St. Mary's Industrial School and Orphanage, which were made available by His Grace Archbishop Thomas Pothacamury of Bangalore for the teaching of pre-clinical and para-clinical subjects.

St. Martha's Hospital conducted by the Sisters of the Good Shepherd Congregation was affiliated to the College for Clinical Teaching. The Hospital was extended and suitably equipped for the purpose. This hospital provided a practical example of the spirit of service and sacrifice, which the College strives to make its own and carry beyond itself, to the homes of the patients and the community, both in the urban and in the rural areas. The affiliation of the Hospital to the College has been discontinued from 1983.

**Campus :** In June 1968, five years after its establishment, the College moved to its permanent campus on a 140 acres site situated in the periphery of the city of Bangalore. During the first phase of construction, the following were completed: the teaching centre (housing the pre-clinical and para-clinical departments and lecture theatres); four blocks of students' hostel; and some residences for the teaching staff.

**St. John's Medical College Hospital :** The construction work of the second phase consisting of a 800-bed hospital, Nurses' hostel and residences of Staff was started in April 1971. The Out-patient departments were opened on December 8, 1975. Thereafter, the in-patient departments were opened gradually. With the third phase of construction completed in 1987, the campus has all the required facilities including a beautiful auditorium, with 1100 seats, from 1996, as a memorial of the Silver Jubilee of this institution. At present St. John's Medical College Hospital has 1350 in — patient beds, distributed among the Departments of General Medicine, Medical Oncology, Endocrinology, General Surgery, Surgical Oncology, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Gynaecologic Oncology, Paediatrics, Paediatric Surgery, Radiology, Psychiatry, Thoracic Surgery, Dental Surgery, Plastic Surgery, Ophthalmology, Dermatology, Venerology and Leprology, Genito -Urinary Surgery, ENT Diseases, Nephrology, Orthopaedics, Intensive Care, Cardiac Care, Cardiology, Neurology, Neuro-Surgery,

Gastroenterology, Emergency Medicine, Anaesthesiology, Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation, Pain and Palliative Care, Pulmonary Medicine, Neonatology, Transfusion Medicine, Geriatric Medicine, Critical Care Medicine, Radio immuno-Assay and Hemo-Dialysis. This is the teaching Hospital of our College.

**The College of Nursing** is situated in the College & Hospital Sector. Started as a School of Nursing on July 1, 1980, it was raised to the status of a College of Nursing on September 25, 1989 and conducts courses in General Nursing & Midwifery, Basic B.Sc., Post Certificate B.Sc. and M.Sc. Nursing Courses in Medical Surgical, Community Health, Paediatrics, Obst. and Gynae and Psychiatry.

In December 1994, the Institution was re-named as St. John's National Academy of Health Sciences and five institutes were placed under it:

- 1) St. John's Medical College;
- 2) St. John's College of Nursing;
- 3) St. John's Institute of Hospital Administration and Allied Health Sciences;
- 4) St. John's Medical College Hospital;
- 5) St. John's Research Institute

In the Consequent years from 2000 a number of Super Speciality courses (DM & M.Ch) were introduced in the teaching hospital. As of now, we have the following Super Speciality Departments: Cardiology/ Cardio Thoracic Surgery / Critical Care Medicine / Endocrinology/ Gastroenterology / Gynaecologic Oncology / Medical Oncology/ Neonatology / Nephrology / Neurology / Neurosurgery / Paediatric Surgery / Palliative Medicine / Plastic Surgery / Reconstructive Surgery & Burns/ Pulmonary Medicine / Radiation Oncology/ Surgical Oncology / Urology.

In 2014, The Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike honoured the St. John's Medical College & Hospital with Kempe Gowda Award - 2014 in recognition for its contribution to Health Care given in the Metropolitan City.

In the year 2015, the Times of India honoured St. John's Medical College & Hospital with best Multi Speciality Hospital Award in India.

The Academy started Post Graduate Course in Hospital Administration (MHA) in the year 2015 with an intake of 30 seats.

The Medical College celebrated its Golden Jubilee during the year 2013-2014 and it was proposed to create necessary infrastructure in Medical College to increase intake of MBBS admissions from 60 seats to 150 seats. A Golden Jubilee Block was constructed attached to the existing Medical College Building with all infrastructures as per the requirements of Medical Council of India.

### **III. COURSES OF STUDY**

#### **A. M.Sc. NURSING**

The M.Sc. Nursing Programme of two years duration leading to a Master's Degree in Nursing by the Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences is designed to enable the graduates with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing to acquire greater knowledge and understanding in order to function efficiently and effectively as clinicians, educators and managers, and to assume professional leadership.

#### **1. Educational Objectives**

Under the overall aims and goals of the C.B.C.I. Society for Medical Education, the following are the main objectives of the course. At the completion of the course the Post Graduates are expected to have:

- (a) the ability to give quality care to patients in the clinical areas (both in general and specialised) based on comprehensive problem solving approach;
- (b) the ability to function as effective educators and managers with the application of modern concepts and technology;
- (c) leadership abilities to initiate and bring about changes in all areas of nursing practice;
- (d) the ability to critically evaluate and use the findings of research for better practices and to engage in research activities;
- (e) interesting continuing education and contribute to professional advancement;

- (f) the ability to develop a collaborative relationship with organisations, agencies and individuals concerned with delivery of health care.

## **2. Duration of the Course**

The course consists of 2 academic years. At the end of each year there will be University Examinations.

## **3. Clinical specialisation**

- a) Medical Surgical Nursing -10 seats
- b) Community Health Nursing - 6 seats
- c) OBG Nursing - 6 Seats
- d) Paediatric Nursing - 6 seats
- e) Psychiatric Nursing -5 seats

Candidates may opt for any of these specializations. The final decision of granting the option lies with the College.

## **4. Admission Requirements**

- a) The college admits only women candidates.
- b) Minimum educational qualification is B.Sc. Nursing Degree of Raji Gandhi/Bangalore University or any of the other University considered to a equivalent by the rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences.
- c) One year's experience, (after passing B.Sc. (N) Examination should be in any clinical/teaching areas, either in a hospital or in a community.
- d) Preference will be given to those who have atleast 6 months of experience in the area of clinical speciality that the candidate wishes to select for Post Graduation.
- e) In the case of Post Basic B.Sc. Graduates, experience after their P.B. B.Sc. will not be compulsory.
- f) Registration with the State Nursing Council.
- g) 55% marks in the first attempt at the B.Sc./P.B.B.Sc Nursing Examination. For SC/ST of Karnataka State only 50%.

h) The Candidates should submit an application to the Registrar, Admissions Office, St. John's National Academy of Health Sciences, Bangalore 560 034 in the prescribed form. Prospects and application forms can be downloaded from the website: [www.st.johns.in](http://www.st.johns.in)

i) Enclosures:

It is the responsibility of the candidate to complete the application and the enclosures correctly. ***Incomplete applications will be rejected.***

Completed application forms along with relevant enclosures as detailed below should reach the Office of the REGISTRAR not later than 15-05-2017, even if qualifying examination results are not available by that date.

## **5. Selection and Admission.**

(a) Hall Ticket will be sent to the Candidates who meet the above requirements for an Entrance Test and Interview. The Entrance Test will include questions on the Nursing Subjects.

Note: Answers must be marked with Pencil on the answer booklet provided.



- (b) The entrance test and interview will be conducted on 26th May, 2017
- (c) The Candidates called for interview will produce the following documents to be eligible to appear for the interview:
- Original Mark List of 10th Std., PUC and qualifying exam
  - Original B.Sc./P.C.B.Sc. Degree Certificate
  - Mark Lists of all Semesters/Academic Years Domicile Certificate (if from Karnataka)
  - Conduct Certificate from the last employer
  - Registration certificate of B. Sc., General Nursing & Midwifery
  - Original Experience Certificate
  - Physical Fitness Certificate
- (d) Candidates will have to make their own arrangements for accommodation during entrance test and the interview.
- (e) The list of selected candidates will be announced on 29th of May, 2017
- (f) Admission procedure to be completed on 31st May 2017
- (g) Admission given is provisional until the following Certificates are produced and the candidate's admission is approved by the Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences:
- i. Transfer Certificate
  - ii. Migration Certificate (for candidates who have completed the qualifying examination under universities outside Karnataka)
  - iii. Eligibility Certificate from RGUHS, Bangalore - 41.
- (h) Any dispute regarding the admission procedure is subject to the jurisdiction of courts in Bangalore only.

## **6. Fees**

**Fees and Deposits paid are not refundable. If a candidate discontinues the course, she needs to pay the fees of the following years of the course as per the prospectus.**

## **7. Accommodation**

Students may opt to stay in the Hostels or come from home. But the option should be clearly stated at the time of admission.

### **III COURSES OF STUDY**

#### **B. BASIC B.SC. (NURSING) DEGREE COURSE**

This programme of study leads to a Basic B.Sc. (Nursing) degree of the Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences with an intake of 100 seats.

##### **1. Educational Objectives**

Under the overall aims and goals of the C.B.C.I., the following are the main objectives of the course. At the completion of the course the graduates are expected to :

- (a) have a broad concept of the fundamental principles of quality nursing care, and demonstrate skill in providing nursing care to people of all age groups based on principles of physical, biological and behavioural sciences in an institution or in a community setting;
- (b) participate as members of the health care team in promotive, preventive and restorative health care delivery system of the country;
- (c) demonstrate leadership qualities and decision making abilities in various nursing situations;
- (d) demonstrate skill in teaching and supervising nursing care both in the hospital and in community setting;
- (e) recognise the need for continued learning, and for personal and professional growth;
- (f) uphold ethical and Christian values;
- (g) advance without further formal education to positions which require skills in clinical teaching and unit management.

##### **2. Duration of the Course**

The course consists of 4 years.

##### **3. Entrance Requirements**

Admission is open to all candidates who fulfil the following requirements.

- (1) The College admits only female candidates.
- (2) The Candidates should have completed 17 years of age on or before 31st December 2017.

- (3) Minimum educational qualification is pass in the Pre-University examination of Karnataka Board of Pre-University Education with an aggregate of 45% in Physics, Chemistry and Biology as optional subjects (40% for SC & ST Candidates) OR any other examination recognized by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences as equivalent to 2 years P.U.C. English as a subject in PUC is mandatory.

EQUIVALENCY IS DETERMINED ONLY BY THE RAJIV GANDHI UNIVERSITY OF HEALTH SCIENCES, BANGALORE.

Students awaiting results also may apply.

- (4) The Candidates should possess good health and moral character.
- (5) The Religious Sisters should have completed one year after their religious profession and should not be beyond 35 years of age.
- (6) The Candidates should submit an application to the Registrar in the prescribed form. Prospects and application forms can be downloaded from the website: [www.stjohns.in](http://www.stjohns.in)

### **C. POST BASIC B.SC. NURSING COURSE**

This programme of study is for registered nurses holding certificates in General Nursing and Midwifery and leads to a Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing of the Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences with an intake of 60 seats.

The course of study is for a period of 2 years. The general educational courses of the first year provide a sound base upon which advanced nursing courses are built.

### **1. Educational Objectives**

A graduate of the programme should:

- 1) interpret, demonstrate and administer high quality nursing care to people of all ages in homes, hospitals and other community agencies in urban and rural areas;
- 2) apply knowledge from the physical, biological, and behavioural sciences in assessing the health status of individuals, and make critical judgements in planning, directing and evaluating primary, acute and long term care given by themselves and others working with them;
- 3) investigate health care problems systematically;
- 4) work in collaboration with members of other allied disciplines towards attaining optimum health for all citizens of the society;
- 5) teach and counsel individuals, families and other groups about health and illness;
- 6) understand human behaviour, and establish effective interpersonal relationship with individuals, families and groups;
- 7) recognize the various forces affecting the community's health and welfare programmes; participate in identifying, planning and carrying out community health programmes which meet the community's expectation;
- 8) demonstrate teaching and administrative skills in the clinical nursing situation as well as in formal nursing education programmes;
- 9) assume responsibility for continued learning and for increasing competence in nursing practice;
- 10) uphold ethical and Gospel values in their personal and professional life.

### **D. DIPLOMA COURSE IN GENERAL NURSING AND MIDWIFERY**

The College of Nursing conducts the General Nursing and Midwifery Course, of three years duration. The course is recognized by the Karnataka State Nursing Council of Karnataka and the Indian Nursing Council with an intake of 100 seats.

#### **1. Objectives**

At the end of three years of study, the student is expected to :

- a) have the aptitude, knowledge and skill necessary for assessing nursing needs of the individuals throughout the life-cycle, families and communities;
- b) apply relevant knowledge from biological and behavioural sciences in planning and carrying out safe nursing care activities;

- c) co-operate with other members of the health team in the hospital or in the community in prevention of disease, promotion of health, restoration of health and rehabilitation;
- d) impart health knowledge to individuals and groups through health education;
- e) demonstrate skill in the use of problem solving methods in nursing practice;
- f) demonstrate ability to supervise and guide auxiliary personnel who are part of the nursing team;
- g) demonstrate understanding of and commitment to professional behaviour;
- h) carry out the above in the true Christian spirit of service to fellowmen and be committed to the welfare of our country.

## **2. Admission Requirements**

- (1) Minimum and Maximum age for admission will be 17 and 35 years. There is no age bar for ANM/LHV
- (2) Minimum education.

  - 10+2 vocational ANM under CBSE Board or other equivalent board from the school and recongnized by Indian Nursing Council with 40% marks.
  - Registered as ANM with State Nursing Registration Council.
- (3) Student shall be medically fit.
- (4) Candidates should be single (female only), of good health and good moral character.
- (5) Students qualified in 10+2 Arts or Science examination or Health care Science-Vocational stream ONLY conducted by National Institute of Open School with 40% marks

- (7) Religious Sisters, who apply, should have completed one year after their first religious profession.

## **F. NURSE PRACTITIONER IN CRITICAL CARE NURSING**

Subject to the approval of the Indian Nursing Council, the first batch of Nurse Practitioner Course (Critical Care Residency programme) is likely to commence from April, 2017.

This course is a 2 year programme which prepare nurses to function in Critical Care areas of tertiary care settings. (Details are available on INC website)

### **Objective:**

On completion of the program, the NP will be able to:

1. Assume responsibility and accountability to provide competent care to critically ill patients and appropriate family care in tertiary care centres
2. Demonstrate clinical competence / expertise in providing critical care which includes diagnostic reasoning, complex monitoring and therapies
3. Apply theoretical, patho-physiological and pharmacological principles and evidence base in implementing therapies / interventions in critical care

4. Identify the critical conditions using differential diagnosis and carry out treatment/interventions to stabilize and restore patient's health and minimize or manage complications independently or collaboratively as a part of critical care team.
5. Collaborate with other health care professionals in the critical care

### **Duration of the Course**

The duration is of two years with the curriculum consisting of theory that includes core courses, advanced practice courses and clinical courses besides clinical practicum which is a major component.

### **Admission Requirement:**

1. The college admits only Women candidates
2. Applicants must possess a registered B.Sc Nurse with a minimum of one year clinical experience, preferably in any critical care setting prior to enrolment.
3. Must have undergone the BSc Nursing in an institution recognized by the Indian Nursing Council.
4. Must have scored not less than 55% aggregate marks in the BSc program
5. Should be a Registered Nurse in State Nursing Council
6. Selection will be based on the merit of an entrance examination and interview held by the competent authority.

## V. GENERAL

1. Students must be regular and punctual at lectures, demonstrations, seminars, practicals, field work and other academic exercises. They are required to attend all allotted working periods in each of the prescribed subjects. If so recommended by the respective Heads of Departments, the Principal may under the Regulations of Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences condone shortage of attendance upto 20 percent caused by illness and such other valid reasons.
2. Students whose conduct, or attendance, or progress is not satisfactory will not be allowed to appear for the University or Board Examination, and are also liable to be asked to leave the College.
3. A language course is conducted in Kannada; the course is compulsory for all new entrants who do not know the language.
4. Attendance at courses in Human Formation, including Medical Ethics, Rural Orientation Programmes and Behavioural Sciences arranged by the College is compulsory.
5. In case of non-attendance of classes, an application must be presented to the Principal for leave of absence giving the reasons.
6. Membership in the recognized Student Nurses' Association is compulsory.
7. Catholic students are encouraged to join the Catholic Nurses' Guild of India.
8. Students must be neat and tidy in their dress, avoiding expensive clothes and exaggerated fashions.
9. Students must wear the prescribed uniform for duty.
10. Students must maintain a sense of decorum and discipline inside the College and in its associated institutions, and in public places. 'Ragging' is strictly prohibited. Students should refrain from disfiguring walls and furniture, and from other objectionable practices.
11. Students are required to carry their Identity Cards certified up-to-date, on their persons at all times.
12. The Catholic students have to attend Christian Doctrine classes and the retreats organized annually. They are urged and

encouraged to attend the Eucharistic Celebration as often as possible and to make use of facilities made available to help their all-round formation as committed Christian nurses.

13. Once the parents decide to have their ward as a day scholar, the status cannot be changed thereafter.
14. A student who discontinues the course after admission but before the commencement will not be entitled for refund of the fees already paid and deposits made to the Institution unless the seat that has fallen vacant due to the discontinuation, is filled up by another candidate. In such a case, an amount equal to 10% of the total fees payable will be deducted as service charges.

If a student discontinues the course during the course period for any other reason, she will have to pay the fees for the remaining period of the course to the Institution, and shall also forfeit all the deposits and other fees paid to the Institution.

15. The Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore, to which our College is affiliated has sent a Circular dated 1 st February 1997 on Ragging. We would like to bring the important part of the contents of this Circular to the notice of our students:

“Ragging is a Cognisable Offence and that any person caught indulging in Ragging shall be liable to imprisonment for a term which may extend to one year, or with fine as stipulated therein”.

“Principals are instructed to inform the Police and take necessary steps to dismiss the Student”.

Ragging in any form is prohibited in the campus. In addition any student indulging in any form of Ragging in the Hostel will be debarred from Hostels of this Institution. She will have to make alternate arrangements for accommodation. Names of the students found ragging will be sent to the Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore, for further action.

All day scholars are also reminded that they are not allowed in any of the blocks in the Hostel and all Residents in the Hostel are hereby warned that any act of ragging either in the blocks or in the common rooms or in the dining halls, recreation room, sports grounds, etc., is strictly prohibited.

Any Students who indulge in any form of Ragging will undergo severe punishment including immediate expulsion from the Hostel etc.

The motto of the emblem, HE SHALL LIVE BECAUSE OF ME, links this Institution with the XXXVIII International Eucharistic Congress held in Bombay in December 1964, of which it is the Chief Memorial. The motto is a constant reminder to our Staff and Students that they are God's collaborators in their care of human lives.

The colour scheme: The cross is WHITE, signifying purity of spirit; the body of the man lying down is BLUE, signifying aspiration towards heavenly things; and the background is GOLD or YELLOW, signifying the flame of knowledge.
